

Program about Soviet mass murder and cover-up

The Buchtel College of Arts and Sciences invites members of the UA campus community to a special program, titled "KATYŃ, Soviet Mass Murder and Cover-up," on Thursday, Feb. 3, at 5 p.m. in Zook Hall 110.

The murders of members of the Polish elite by the Soviet Union was one of the most closely guarded secrets of World War II. Stalin's order to kill 22,000 representatives of the Polish elite came to light only in 1990, and the Katyn victims still await justice.
